

ADVANCED CRITICAL THINKING, CERTIFICATE

The Herd Humanities* Certificate in Advanced Critical Thinking will be a 16-credit hour program that begins with a two-course sequence in Transformative Texts (SCLA 101 and SCLA 102, typically taken in the first year), followed by three courses in a chosen track (see below) and a one-credit course to foster Community Engagement beyond the classroom.

Students can choose among these tracks (three courses):


- Science & Technology
- Environment & Sustainability
- Healthcare & Medicine
- Management & Organization
- Conflict Resolution & Justice

Each track includes a range of options in the existing College of Liberal Arts course offerings. Students must choose courses from at least two departments within the track.

Review of course options will be conducted regularly to ensure all courses on the list are active. Faculty may propose additional courses that align with program goals; additions will be made at the discretion of the program director and with approval from department chair.




*Herd Humanities is an inter-disciplinary program housed in the College of Liberal Arts. It is being developed with the support of a grant from the Teagle Foundation (Cornerstone: Learning for Living). Co-PI's on the grant are Dr. Allison Carey, Dr. Zelideth Rivas, and Prof. Daniel O'Malley. The program's goals are to streamline and add coherence to students' gen-ed experience and to showcase the utility of study in the Humanities regardless of a students' major/discipline/career aspiration.
