- Areas of Emphasis: 18 hours (CJ 200 Intro to Criminal Justice, CJ 302 CJ Research Methods, CJ 322 Criminal Law & Procedure, CJ 404 Theoretical Criminology and CJ 492 Senior Seminar do not count toward the 18 hours of CJ electives.)
 - Students who do not select an area of emphasis take both CJ 211 Intro to Law Enforcement and CJ 231 Intro to Corrections as well as a variety of criminal justice electives to suit their career interests to complete the 18 hours of CJ electives.
